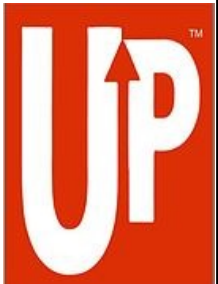

### Defense for Children International-Palestine

AFSC has partnered with Defense for Children on the No Way to Treat a Child campaign to expose the widespread abuse of Palestinian children by Israeli soldiers. Every year, Israel prosecutes between 500-700 Palestinian children in military courts and holds them in the military detention system. The minors are often pulled from their homes unannounced, subjected to lengthy interrogations, and physically assaulted.
