

Mesquakie Friends

We have been to many wakes and burials of the Meskwaki people during the last 3 months. We always feel blessed to sit in the ceremonial long houses with them as they spend these last sacred hours with their loved ones. It is a beautiful way of letting go. Their traditions at death are beautiful and a source of hope during these times of great loss. Like us, the Meskwaki people believe they will go to a better place to be with the Creator. Death is just a passing from one place to another. We often share with the mourning families this quote of William Penn: “They that love beyond the world cannot be separated by it, death cannot kill what never dies. Nor can spirits ever be divided that love and live in the same divine principle, the root and record of their friendship. If absence be not death, neither is theirs. Death is but crossing the world, as friends do the seas; they live in one another still.” The Mesquakie Newsletter is on the bulletin board.
