

**Improve access to safety net programs.**

AFSC has worked for years to make critical benefits like SNAP (food assistance), Medicaid, and unemployment insurance more widely available. In West Virginia, we have successfully advocated for the state to remove time limits, work requirements, and other obstacles to assistance. As this public

health crisis continues and after it ends, we will keep working until each person in our country can meet basic needs.

In Georgia, residents began to face evictions when unemployment skyrocketed last year. We worked with local partners to launch a statewide Covid19 housing emergency hotline to help people negotiate arrangements to stay in their homes. Our efforts will help protect tenants rights and make sure people have access to stable housing.

**Mesquakie Friends**

We have been to many wakes and burials of the Meskwaki people during the last 3 months. We always feel blessed to sit in the ceremonial long houses with them as they spend these last sacred hours with their loved ones. It is a beautiful way of letting go. Their traditions at death are beautiful and a source of hope during these times of great loss. Like us, the Meskwaki people believe they will go to a better place to be with the Creator. Death is just a passing from one place to another. We often share with the mourning families this quote of William Penn: "They that love beyond the world cannot be separated by it, death cannot kill what never dies. Nor can spirits ever be divided that love and live in the same divine principle, the root and record of their friendship. If absence be not death, neither is theirs.
