He earned his high school diploma as well as his ServSafe and Bellissimo Barista Training certifications through the Growing Teens for Life vocational development program. Drew has obtained a full-time job at a greenhouse in his community and is supporting his young family. When "Drew" left White's, he was more calm, motivated, and determined to remain sober for himself and his family.
