The Gilead House specializes in drug and alcohol addiction recovery and provides resources to those re-entering society from jail or prison.

Most women who come to Gilead House are recently released from jail or prison with a current or prior felony charge. Women come voluntarily and agree to participate in intensive out-patient addiction recovery programming while staying at Gilead House. Gilead House is able to provide services to 27 women at one time and works closely with other agencies such as Open Arms, Rescue Mission FSA Domestic Violence Shelter, Turning Point, CAM & Project Access. Gilead House receives additional help from Gordon Food Service, Indiana Health Care and many local churches.
